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# Working with your Preset

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## Quick tips for adjusting your preset filters.

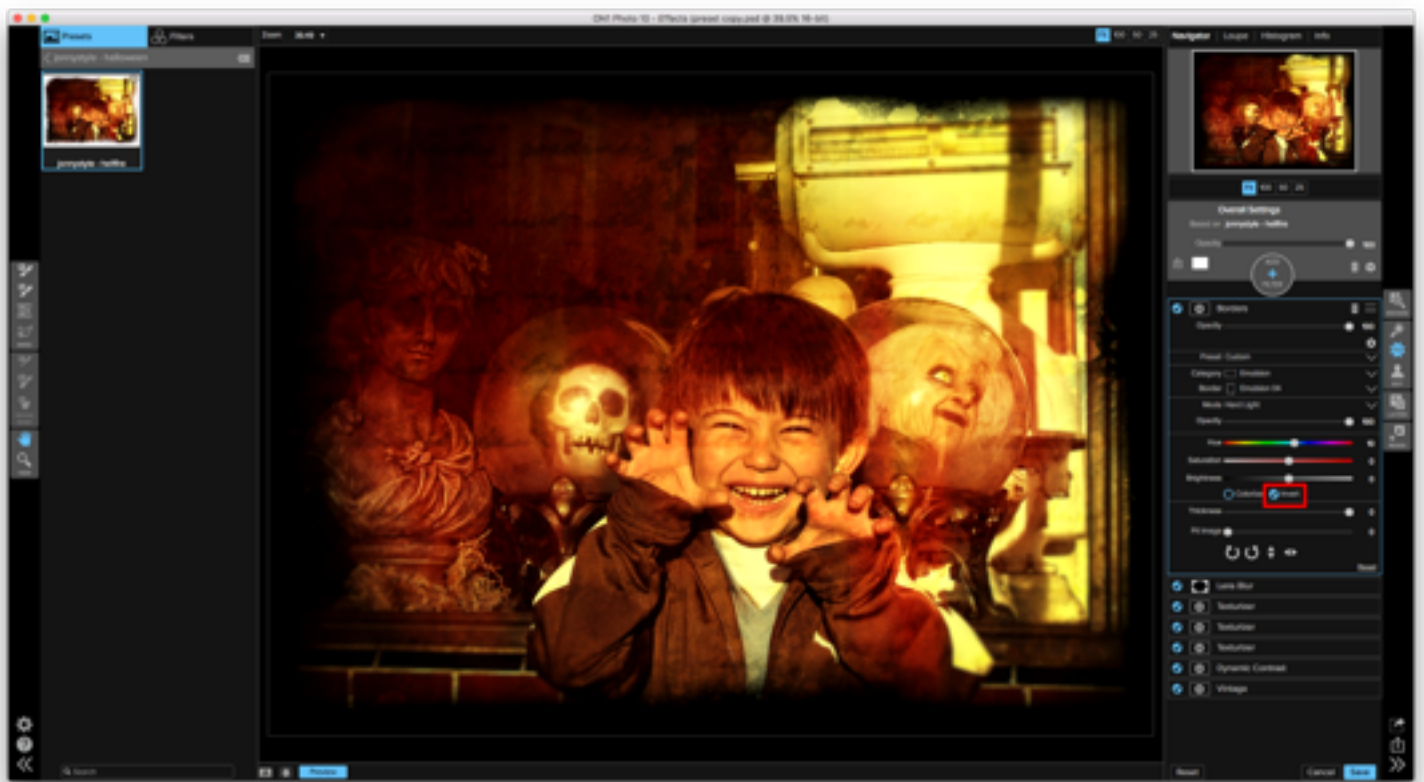
Presets are great for quick and easy edits created from multiple Filter effects. But there are a lot of times where you may not like a particular element included in the preset and want to remove it or adjust them.

### Adjusting Border:

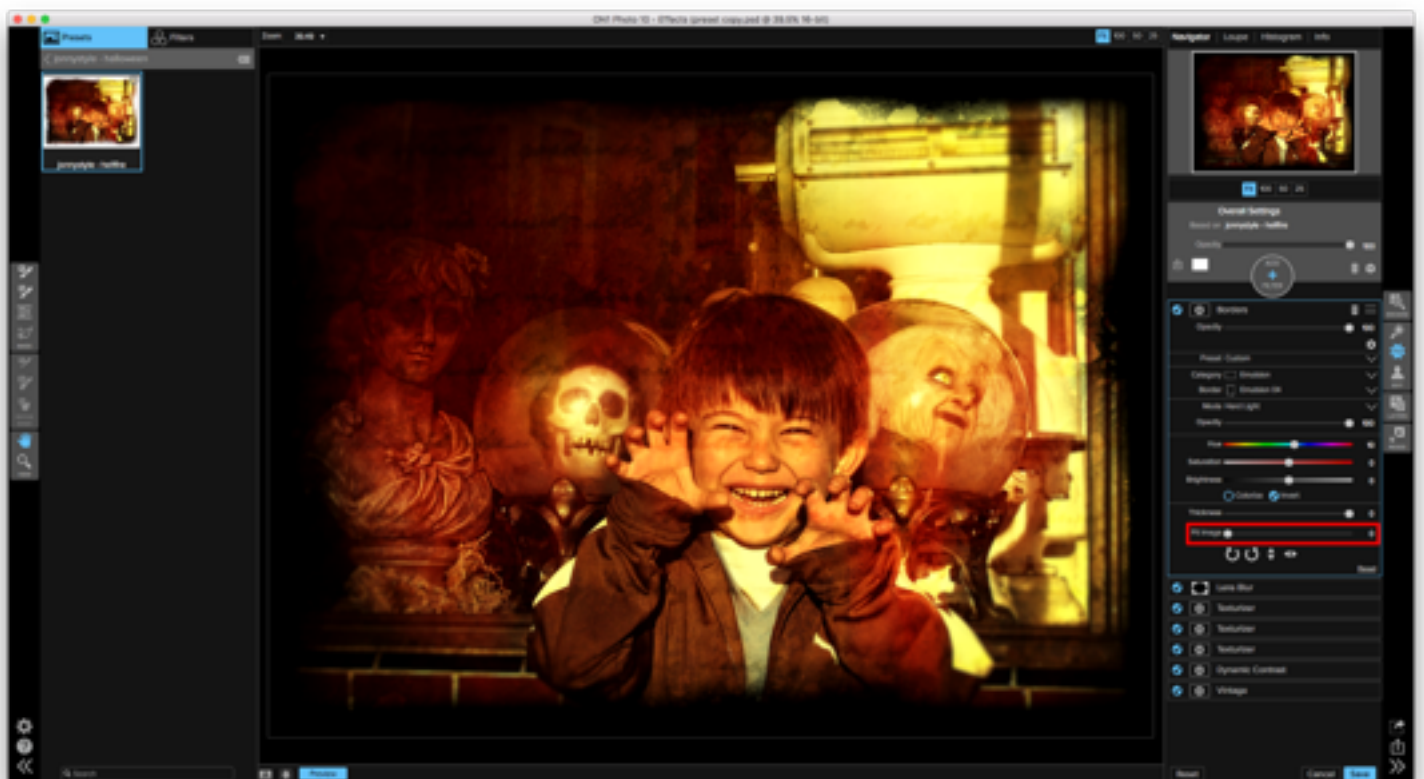
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In the Borders pane click the Invert button to invert the white border to black.

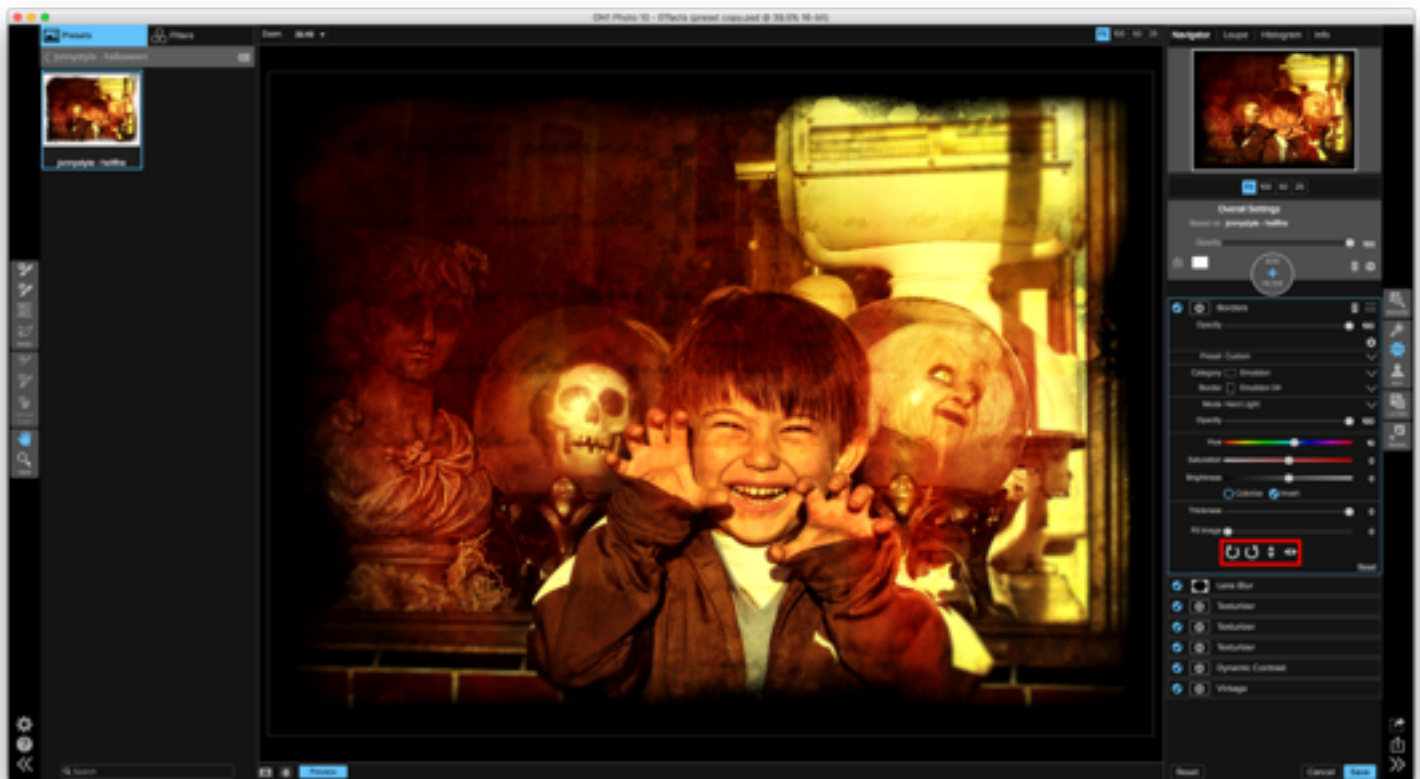




To better fit your image to the border adjust the Fit Image slider. This is helpful if there are details in the original image close to the edges you may want to see that are being covered by the border.



You can also rotate the border, which can sometimes look better, or if you want to use the same preset on multiple images and give them each a slightly different look.



## Adjusting Textures:

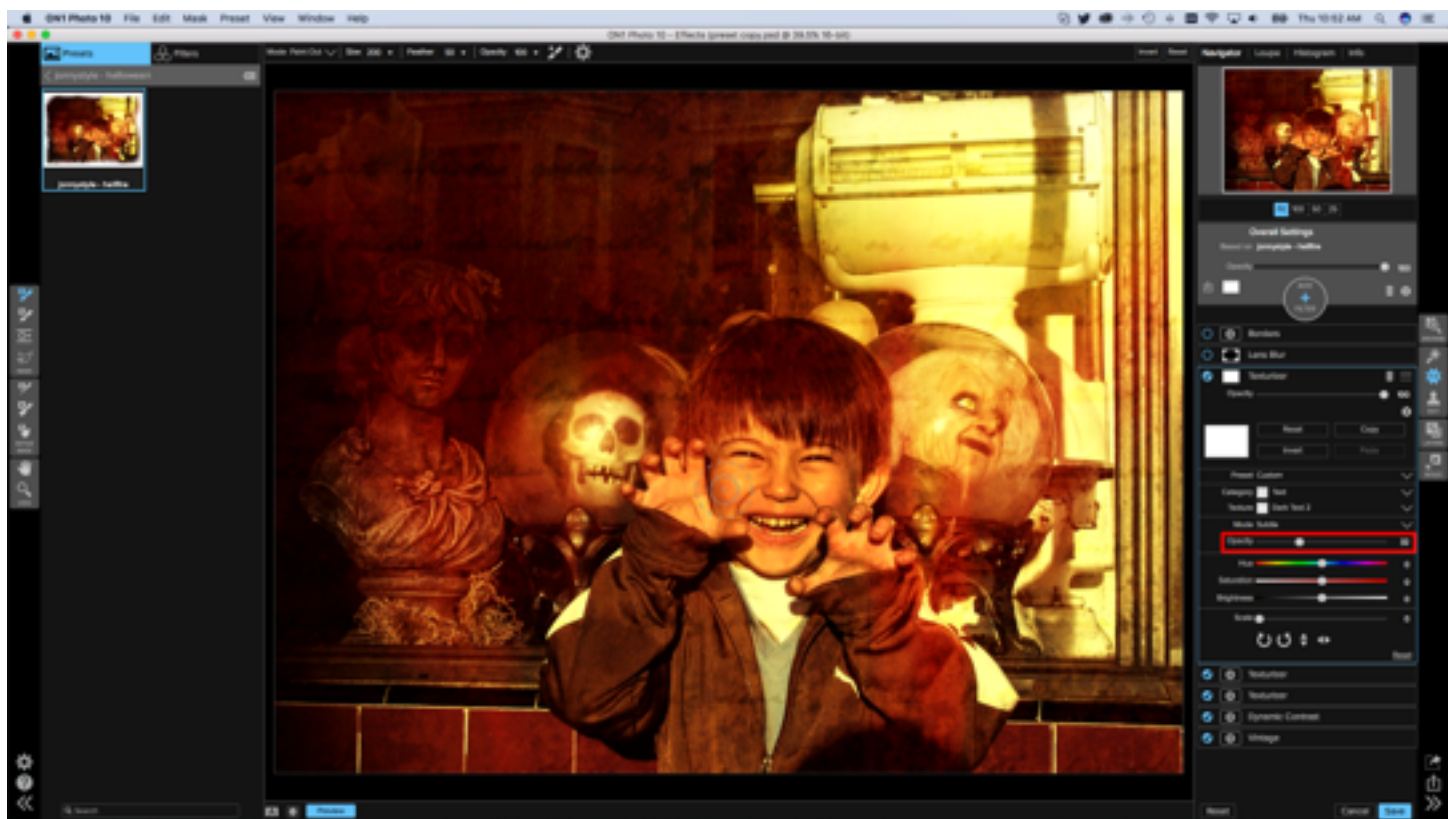
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### Text Texture:

You can adjust the opacity of the Text effect to increase or decrease it's intensity. For this image I wanted just the slight hint of text over the entire image.

In the Filter stack, select the top most Texturizer filter.





Also, changing the blending mode can increase or decrease the intensity of the effect.

Click the Blending Mode drop down and you can mouse over each mode to get a realtime preview of the change in blending modes.



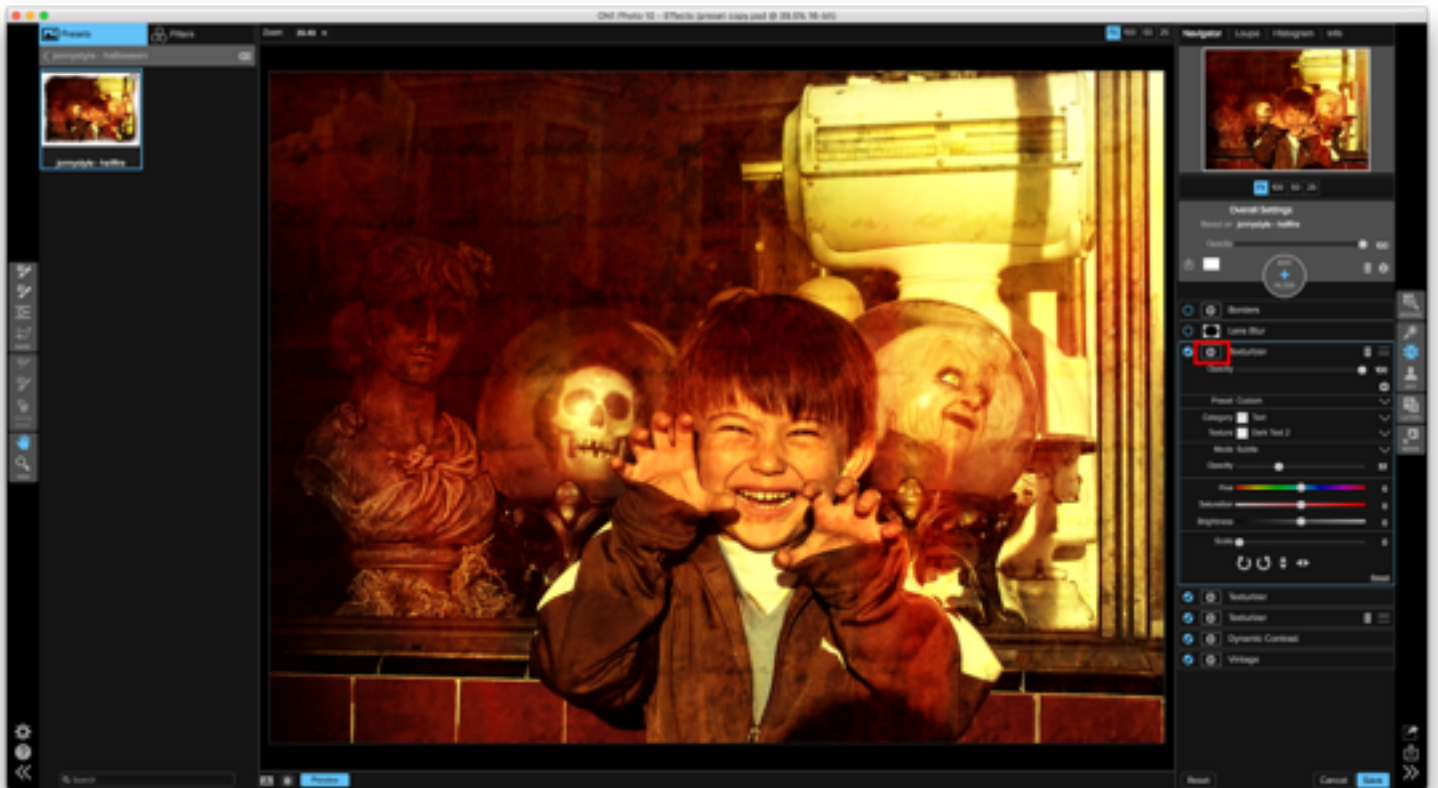
## Masking Preset Effect From Parts of the Image

With this image, I want to remove some of the Text Texture effect from the face.

Make sure you select the correct Texturizer layer you want to mask on.

Click the Mask icon in the Texturizer Filter pane :

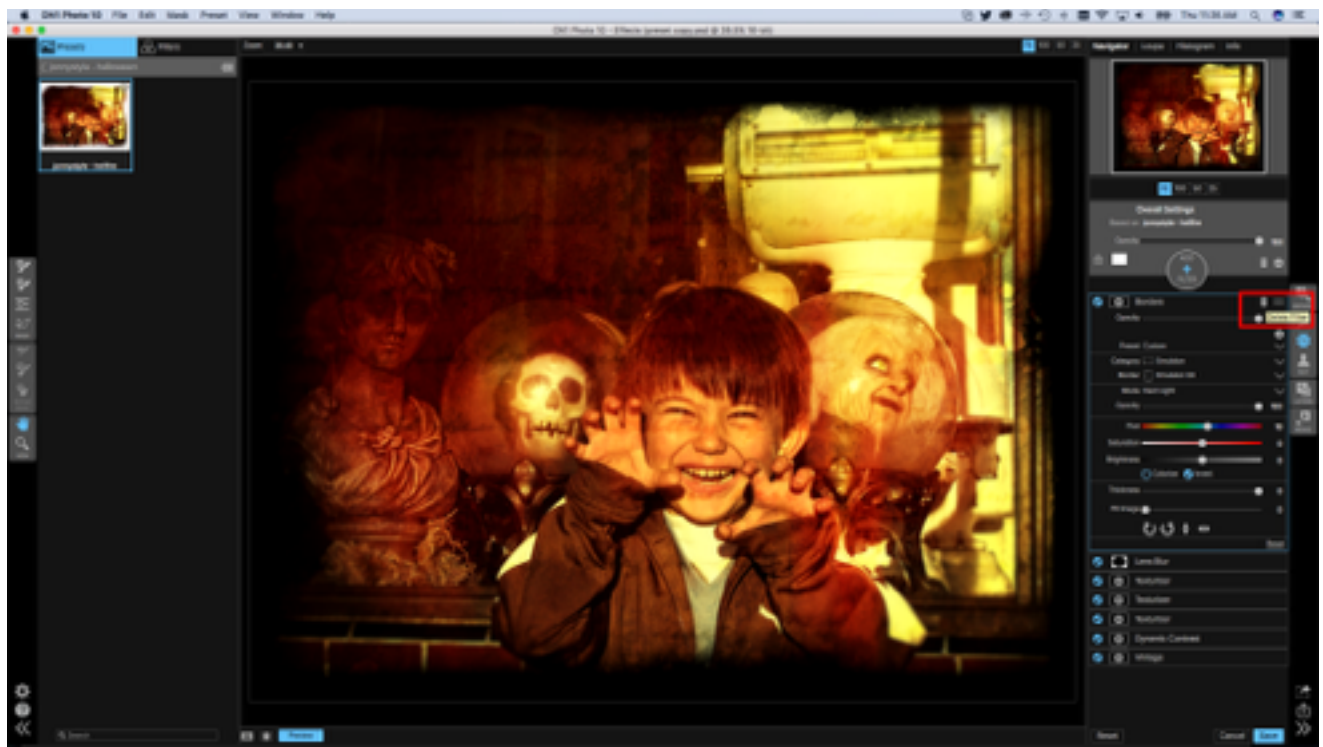




Now just paint over the area where you want to remove the effect from.



If you want to entirely remove the Text effect or any other effect just click the trash can in the Filter pane of the particular Filter you want to remove.



If you want to remove the entire preset from the image, just click the trash can in the Overall Settings pane.

This will remove all the Filters and allow you start from scratch.
